




The IB Curriculum Framework


Diploma Programme (DP)


- The IB DP is recognized as the "gold standard" for entry into higher education and has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities.

Frequently Asked Questions

When Is The Application Deadline?

As spaces are limited early inquiry in January/February is recommended for September entry. However, as we are an international school, applications are accepted year round, and applications made throughout the academic year will be reviewed on an individual basis.

What Is The Birthday Cutoff Date For Entry?

Birth date entry is by December 31st for each class level. For example:

To enter Reception a child must be three years old by December 31st. To enter Kindergarten a child must be four years old by December 31st. To enter Transition a child must be five years old by December 31st.

What Is The School Year?

The school year runs from early September to late June. Check out the calendar on our website.

What Are The School Hours?

The school runs Monday through Friday and the hours are: 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM for Early Years classes 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM for Grades 1-5 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM for Grades 6-12

Do You Offer After School Activities?

We offer on campus afterschool activities every day from monday to friday from 3:35 PM to 4:35 PM. Contact us at info@isbologna.com for more information.

Is Italian Taught?

Italian is taught from Grade 1 upwards, either as a language acquisition or at a mother tongue level depending on the student's background. All other classes are taught in English. Starting in Secondary School, students also choose a foreign languages to study, selecting between French and Spanish.
